This 17,718 square foot law enforcement center cost over \$3 million and involved an extensive security system, including cameras, electronic door controls, intercom, and personal duress alarm system sensors.

Bergstrom Electric served as the Prime Electrical Contractor and began work on the project in October of 2007.

The electric system included a 1200 amp 120/208 V 3 phase MDP and an 800 Amp 120/208 Volt 3 phase system for the boiler. Bergstrom technicians also installed 23,200 feet of conduit, 102,500 feet of wire, 286 light fixtures, and 216 outlets.

It took 3804 man-hours to complete the job, which was finished in January of 2009.
